



Financial Statement 2024



As of June 30, 2024, The Land Institute's financial outlook remains secure and strong relative to its size. We continue to maintain a healthy cash reserve to ensure the continuity of our long-term mission. In early 2024, we deployed an investment strategy to manage our reserve in alignment with our organizational values.

Federal and state funding for perennial grain research and infrastructure was flat in FY24 compared to the previous year, comprising approximately 10% of our revenue. We anticipate that federal funding will decline in FY25 and are proactively tracking and managing our short and long-term exposure to government funding uncertainty.

Philanthropic support continues to be the foundation of our work to mobilize a global movement of researchers, farmers, food and beverage makers, and eaters to realize perennial agriculture at scale. Progress is made possible through the generosity and vision of our donors.

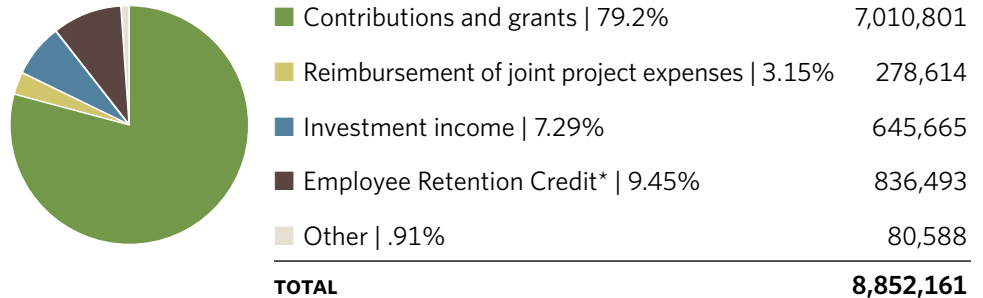

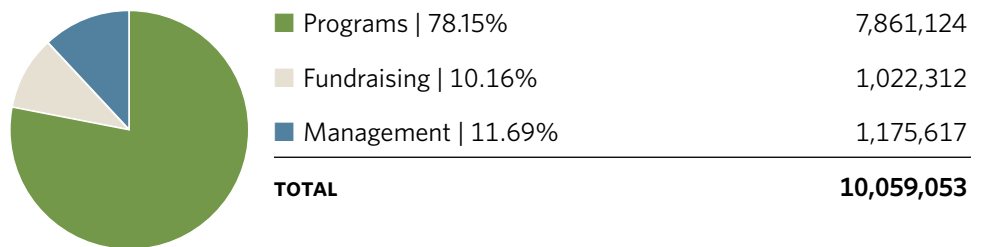
